CONTINUING EDUCATION *by Dr. John Meyer*

Summer is a popular time for professional development. This summer, MLC will offer 102 online and on-location (face-to-face) course opportunities.

On Location: Five districts (PNW, WW, DM, MI, and SA) will host several MLC face-to-face classes during their June conferences. Thirteen Lutheran schools will also host an MLC course for their own faculty and those nearby.

Ministry Certification: District presidents urge all new WELS teachers to take the two-week course Principles of Christian Education before their first year, when possible. MLC will offer three convenient online sections and one face-to-face section in Milwaukee.

Master's Degrees: MLC's master's degrees provide specialized training in areas of theology, technology, special education, teaching, and school leadership. The special education licensure program is very popular, and many teachers and staff ministers are obtaining their master's in theology.

MISSION ADVANCEMENT

BOOSTING FINANCIAL AID BY 10% ANNUALLY!

Through the **Congregational Partner Grant Program (CPGP)**, students received up to \$2,000 every year: \$1,000 from their congregation and a \$1,000 match from MLC. In 2022-23, **we increased the annual maximum to \$2,400**—\$1,200 from the congregation and a \$1,200 MLC match. **In 2023-24, the max will be \$2,650.** We will continue to increase the max by 10% every year in order to decrease the financial burden on our students and their families.

FROM THE PRESIDENT: NAMES...NAMES...AND MORE NAMES!

In three years, I've conducted individual interviews with over 400 new MLC students. Over and over again what I hear are names. I may even have heard your name a time or two . . . or three.

In each interview I ask: "What got you thinking about studying for gospel ministry?" And then come the names—most frequently the names of specific called workers. Often, it's a teacher whose zeal for learning and humble Christ-like love for students led that new MLC student to say: "I want to be like my teacher!" Or it's a pastor who took a moment before or after confirmation class to look a student in the eye and say: "Have you ever thought about becoming a pastor? I see gifts for ministry in you!"

Please don't underestimate the Spirit-empowered influence you have when you carry out your calling with joy and faithfulness! Please don't underestimate the impact of even a brief conversation. I've heard new MLC students recall even the briefest conversations in great detail. You may have forgotten the conversation. They have not.

And may I share an urgent request for a topic to highlight as you encourage that next generation (**and their parents**)? Going far away from home for college—and the potential of being assigned even farther from home—causes significant anxiety for a very anxious generation. That anxiety is the #1 reason many choose another school or vocation even when studying for public ministry at MLC appeals to them!

Please encourage them not to underestimate the support of the faith family waiting for them at MLC. New students report that to me again and again. Assure them that if they are called far from home, Jesus still knows how to provide "brothers, sisters, [and] mothers" (Mk 10:29-30) beyond what we could ever imagine.

Yes, I know, some calling bodies are better than others in surrounding called workers with such support. Yet Jesus still knows how to provide those who beautifully live out that encouragement.

God-willing, next year I'll surpass the 500-visit mark. I look forward to hearing more names. I will thank God for the influence the Spirit gives you every time I hear your name!
