PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29

The Christian Church has been doing the same thing for over 2,000 years; pointing people to Jesus.

When John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him, this was his opportunity to turn people's attention away from him to the One for whom he was preparing the way. This Jesus was the Lamb who would be sacrificed for the sins of the world.

When the Church was persecuted in its early days, those who were dispersed into foreign lands took the gospel with them and continued to point people to Jesus as the Savior of the world. With remarkable resiliency, the Christian Church grew and flourished under such circumstances.

When Luther rediscovered the gospel after years of darkness, he pointed people to Jesus as the center of all hope and salvation. With courage and faithfulness, the confessional church continued to keep their focus on Jesus and point others to do the same.

When missionaries left the European continent to serve the immigrants who came to America for religious freedom and opportunity, with great zeal they pointed people to Jesus as they gathered Christians into congregations and established missions at a remarkable pace.

For over 110 years, Michigan Lutheran Seminary has pointed her students to Jesus as the reason for their certainty for salvation and hope for eternity while also equipping them to carry the mission of John the Baptist to point people to Jesus in the public ministry of the gospel.

While history has plentiful examples of faithful and heroic efforts to point people to Jesus, let's not imagine that this task is complete or an assumed priority for all. As you hear John the Baptist direct people to Jesus, be aware that our mission is the same. 
